1st West Waverley Scout Group - Treasurer's Report

The Profit and Loss for the 12 months ending 30th June 2015 shows Total Income of \$ \$28,241.78 and Total Expenses of \$ \$29,861.72 which, unfortunately, means that we ran at a loss of \$1,619.94.

Fundraising revenue of \$720 is a significant decrease compared to previous years. Hall hire revenue has also declined in the past year. The Masters BBQ was not as successful as we had hope but we still managed to raise \$195.00.

Main increases in Expenses are due to the theft in the hall of copper piping (replacement repairs), and new tyres to the trailer. The good thing is that we are spending more money on Leader training and we have lots of new members so increases in scarf/badge costs. We were also able to send Leaders and Adult helpers to Cuboree.

As at June 2015, we had \$25,400.81 in our everyday bank account and \$30,998.29 in a Term Deposit. This compares to last year when we had \$58,019.04. This represents a decrease of \$1,619.94.

We need your continued support to strengthen the group's reserve of funds, to 'be prepared' for the proposed plans to ensure our Group's success into the future.

GROUP LEADER'S REPORT

In April we celebrated the Group's 50th anniversary. Over 150 current and former members filled the Hall for an afternoon of reminiscing and renewing of friendships with scouts and leaders. Several of the very first 1st West Cubs were in attendance and presented certificates to the most recently invested Joeys. Judging by the 'thankyous' sent to me afterwards, the day was very special in the eyes of many.

Why would men in their 50s and early 60s: surgeons, accountants, engineers, soldiers and artists, come back, some from interstate, to 1st West decades after they left? Same could be asked of parents and leaders from the early years, who are now in their 70s, 80s and 90s? The question I ask of today's members is "Do you think you will have a reason to attend the Group Centenary celebrations in 2064?" If so, that is a great endorsement of what we are doing for you or your child today. If not, why not: are we providing lasting learning, friendships, and achievement for your children? Have you invested enough time and energy into the Group to get the maximum returns scouting offers?

Membership

At 30th June 2015, we had a total of 73 youth members, compared to 67 last year and 61 two years ago. Joeys grew from 9 to 19, with Cubs steady at a very healthy 27, Scouts 13, Venturers 6 and Rovers 8 plus 3 hosted members. We enrolled 28 new members which is only one below our previous year's record - 18 Joeys, 8 Cubs, and 2 scouts. On the downside, we lost 1 Joey, 5 Cubs, 3 linking to Scouts, 2 Scouts, 4 Venturers and 2 Rovers.

The Troop has enjoyed a stable year in terms of numbers and the Venture Unit is growing and is very active in its combined operation with Wirringa. The Crew is losing numbers as its Members reach 26 the end of the youth road.

The Joey Mob and Cub Pack are effectively full. Joeys can only take new members when they pass onto Cubs and Cubs cannot take new members or Joeys coming up until older Cubs link to the Scout Troop. This is a "nice" problem to have as reflects well on the quality of program that our Leaders are providing.

But success needs to be supported, and the parents of this Group are not doing enough.

Too much is left to a dedicated few and too many are taking and not giving. Not enough parents are on the committee, and not enough parents are contributing to fund raisers or donating money, and not enough are becoming leaders. The section reports that follow showcase the range of activities that 1st West provided over the last 12 months.

Leaders

Since last year's ARAP, we have had NO new leaders. This is becoming dire in the Troop where a "retired" leader, Nick Charrett, and current Group Leader are a stop gap.

I thank all Leaders for their contribution to 1st West over the last year, in particular, Section leaders Sarah Thom-Tydell, Fiona Rudd, and Graeme Chard, and Crew Leaders

Lauren Hewitt and Gavin Woolger. Thank you to spouses, partners and children of all our leaders for the support you provide. I would like to acknowledge the role played by families of leaders: husbands, wives, children, and parents. All play a role in supporting the leaders who then play an important role in the development of other family's children.

We had two very long service milestones reached over the last 12 months: 25 years service – Nick Charrett and Michelle Davis.

Committee

The Committee continued to keep the Group functioning effectively. Thank you to Gavin Rudd, Natalie Burke, Diana Angenent and Jo Mitsikas for filling committee positions and regularly attending meetings.

Thanks also to Sue Spence for her continuing work as the editor of the Message Stick and producer of this annual report. And a final thank you to Ash Parfuss, our new scarf maker.

We still need to add parents to the committee. I hope to be able to announce several Cub and Scout parents joining the committee. Every parent is expected to take a turn on the Committee or make a contribution as a Leader or Adult Support.

1ST WEST WAVERLEY SCOUT TROOP ANNUAL REPORT

The Troop continued to consolidate its numbers throughout the year. In Term 2 we re-opened a third patrol Scorpions with Lisa Hawkes as Patrol Leader, who together with Jonty O'Byrne and Owen Colley PLs of Kookas and Koalas respectively, have ably led the Troop. Stradbroke Cup at Easter saw Gold to Kookas and Silver to Koalas: a very pleasing result. Long-time SL, Nick Byrne, retired at the end of 2014 and he compiled a "farewell" article which is well worth recording in the Archives of 1st West Waverley. We have elected to print it here in lieu of a longer Troop report.

Nick 'Noddy/3rd Degree/Bee' Byrne's Life at 1st West Waverley Scout Group...

No more leadering for me at 1st West, but thought I'd talk a bit about my time with the best Scout Group. I started up in Cubs, in Feb of 1980 and enjoyed it, all the way through, going to camps with the Cubs from 1st Korumburra Cub Pack; either there or they came to us. I was in Tawny Six, and became the Sixer when I turned 10. I can't remember much more but when I was going to turn 11 and get sent up to Scouts, I remember saying to mum that it was as far as I would go, as Scouts couldn't be any more fun than Cubs. Mum said to just do a few nights and decide then. Well, guess what? I loved it...!

Scouts was so much more fun than Cubs. We went on heaps of camps and hikes. Back then there were 5 or 6 Leaders, not the 2 or 3 that are around these days. The camps always had Rovers coming along and helping out, which was awesome in itself. They were crazy and adventurous, and usually hurt themselves to make us laugh. Unfortunately, I was unable to go on a Jamboree, and it wasn't until I became a leader that I noticed that I'd really missed out on the time of my life. I recommend it to everyone; don't miss out because you too will regret it.

I became APL and then PL of the Beaver Patrol (in those days Beaver didn't mean what it does now, we were all very innocent or naive). Just before my 15th Birthday, I told mum I was quitting and that Venturers wouldn't be as much fun as Scouts. Again she told me to try a few nights and decide then. Guess what? I loved it!

Venturers was so different to Scouts. Instead of leaders organizing all the nights, we had to organize everything ourselves and, boy, I think every night in my first term was heaps of fun and I loved every minute of it! I can't remember whether it was called VG (Vic Gathering) or MG (Melbourne Gathering), but the camp at the end of the year saw Venturers from around the state come together for a huge camp. There were so many activities, and a disco that ran from 1 am to 5 am. I don't remember sleeping till late Sunday night when I came home, but I do remember setting up my tent and sleeping bag.

We had themed night dinners once a year where we invited family, leaders and anyone else to come along for our annual fundraiser. One year, I remember only 3 people were able to help while we had around 30 family and leaders turn up. They were Natalie Hunt, Andrew Ellingworth and myself. Except for the solid crisp chicken skin that a knife couldn't cut, we managed to run a successful night...

Just before my 18th birthday, mum asked whether I was going up to Rovers and this time I said...... "Yes-sir-ree"! I really wanted to catch up with all the friends that I'd made in Venturers who were older than me and who had already gone up to Rovers. Of course, I loved it! I loved everything about Rovers and our ability to go anywhere because we all had our car licenses. Just the independence we had, to go anywhere without our parents driving us, was fantastic, and also good for our parents. The only problem with Rovers was something that I didn't know until the next financial year; that my parents weren't going to pay for my registration, and now I had to pay it. It was a lot of money back then, but the Group Leader at the time, Tim Glover, told me there was a way to not pay my group registration fee. It was to become a leader, or maybe an Assistant Scout Leader at 1st West. As you know, I took that offer straight away. Unfortunately, straight after that, Tim learnt that he had terminal cancer, and passed away not long afterwards. I was sad to see him go but decided that, even though I hadn't written any paperwork up, I would continue to become a Scout Leader with 1st West. I am surprised it lasted 20 years and 356 days. Even though I didn't make it to 21 years, I was a leader for 21 continuous years at Stradbroke helping the kids work for the GOLD pennant.

Over the years, I have seen so many Scouts come and go and I still keep in contact with some, and even more on the mighty FACEBOOK. Leaders are the same. The first two leaders that I started with were Keith Harvey and Mary Lambert. Mary was a very religious person, and Keith was and is her husband, who had a very dry sense of humour. Boy, we had some great and fun times.

One story that I remember happened at Stradbroke. The leaders there were Adam 'NICNAC' Charrett, Keith 'Lurch' Harvey and myself. We were all sleeping in an old auto tent with the big centre pole. Anyway, one night we left a flap of the tent open and tied it up like an awning. Well... it started to rain late one night and our fantastic awning was catching and holding every little drop. Then, all of a sudden, the water pulled the tent down and towards the front. Adam woke first and said that the tent had fallen down. Keith then said, "Thank goodness because I thought my nose had grown as it's touching the top of the tent", whereas I was at the back of the tent, and said, "Don't you two complain, as I seem to be outside of the tent!". We laughed for an hour while attempting to put the tent back up, and none of the scouts ever found out... Another thing was the phone reception. It was terrible, and we all thought that we could get better reception if we stood on our cars and trailers. One nice scout took this photo while we were being stupid.
