


Membership

Our numbers continued towards growth and indicated a


healthy membership base. We had an overall growth in youth membership, with substantial growth in Scout troop. This is expected as our Scouts grow older and move up over the years.

Treasurer's Report

I am pleased to present the 2021-22 financial report for the 1st West Waverley Scout Group.

Thank you again to Therese Cowan for auditing the financial report.

We ended the financial year with a net profit of just over \$12,300. Highlights from the past financial year included:

- A Government Volunteers Grant of \$4,695. Thank you to Robyn Foley for all your efforts in chasing down grants over the past few years.
- Christmas tree sales in December for a profit of nearly \$5,500. This is a great result given we were only able to sell trees for 2 weekends, due to a shortage of trees. Thank you once again to Mark Parfuss for his tireless efforts and to the parents, leaders and Scouts who assisted with sales.
- An increase in the hall hire fees.
- A major reduction in the electricity expense resulting from the solar panels installed last year.

Our net assets are currently \$40,700.

The annual census on 1 April went smoothly due to the ongoing commitment of Kylie Balmain (registrar) and Greg Robinson (online payment process). Thank you both once again for assisting with this.

Though I say this every year, we shouldn't underestimate the leaders, committee members, parents, and Scouts who to volunteer their time, and once again I thank them for their efforts. Their contribution goes an incredible way to support our children at 1st West.



Group Leader's Report

It is a pleasure to be able to present this report to you in person. And "in person" has at long last been the reality of our scouting world. Nonetheless, this is the third scout year now that has been severely compromised by the lockdowns and other forms of isolation. I will leave it to parents and youth to make their judgement on how scouting has helped you in the covid world.

However, I am very firmly in the camp (haha) that scouts have been a great outlet for all of us. This has been further evidenced by our strong retention rates and participation rates, especially in outdoor and weekend activities.

Fortunately, we were able to proceed with Jamboree in January. Our largest ever contingent to a Jamboree along with 5,000 other Victorian scouts embraced the Heat and Dust that is the standard Jamboree environment but at the same time having fun and making new friends and reinforcing old ones.

At the foot of this report is a list of all the major individual achievements of our Group members. Congratulation to all peak Youth Award recipients: Australian Scout Medallion and Joey Promise Challenge. Thank you to leaders and the committee who passed service milestones and those who were recognised at State and National levels for ongoing exemplary service.

Refresh and renew

One of the downsides of our stop-and-go scouting is that the number of events where parents can come together has been curtailed. I see the effect of this in a lack of engagement of new parents with the committee and leaders. We need to add **new faces**, **new enthusiasm**, **new skills**, **and new backgrounds** to the Committee. The current committee has been superb over the last five years but now **we need parents of Joeys and Cubs** to come on board to learn the ropes and then step into their shoes. Our adult support has to reflect our youth members. Please put up your hand. In Greg Robinson's report, you will see the roles we are looking to fill but mainly it is a numbers game.

Membership

At the census date, we totaled **85 youth** members, compared to 89 in 2021. As of the writing of this report, our membership stands at **90.** These are just off recent record high numbers for 1st West for this century reflecting the demand for scouting and the quality of the program we are offering.

We enrolled 15 new members - 8 Joey, 3 Cub, 1 Scout and 3 Venturer. Retention rates across the Group were above or close to 75% with Venturer retention of 82% the standout.

We continue to have a steady number of enquiries from prospective members.

Leaders

We are not as well placed as we were a year ago. In fact, we need to quickly add to the Joey and Cub leader team, or I can foresee these units declining in quality programming.

We will be farewelling Joey Scout Leader Laura Litcanu Karri very soon as her family have moved to Bayswater and will join a very lucky Scout Group in Knox District. Sarah Thom whose very big scout role is state commissioner STEM has been able to assist less frequently with our Joey Mob. Emily Chen has been powering through her training but needs support urgently.

I have closed the Joey unit in past when leader numbers made it impractical to operate. I would hate to do it again. I love Joey Scouts and don't want to make them sad.

We appreciate all parents who have signed on as Adult Helpers, but only trained leaders can run programs and take responsibility for your children in scouts.

Joey and Cub's parents particularly please talk to me or your children's leaders about the pleasure, responsibilities, and satisfaction of being a scout leader.

As youth numbers stay high more leaders will help maintain the quality of programs and to provide the induvial attention to every member.
